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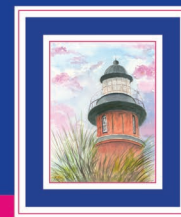

"American Eagle Day" was the theme and "Raptor Encounter" was the name of the program. The Audubon Society of Rhode Island gave an outstanding raptor presentation with a live owl and live hawk, educating all in attendance. A raptor is a special type of bird that captures live prey. Raptors use their powerful, sharp talons to capture their prey and to defend themselves. Several bird species are considered raptors, such as eagles, hawks, kites, falcons, and owls.
